**AIMS Key Indicator System 2018 (AKIS 2018)**

The AIHEC American Indian Measures for Success (AIHEC-AIMS) project has two goals: 1) to define relevant quantitative and qualitative indicator data of American Indian student success, as determined by the tribal colleges, and 2) to develop and implement a strategy for collecting, analyzing, and presenting annually the success indicator data using electronic information management tools. Through data collection and analysis, this project provides the foundation for systemic reform that significantly increases - and for the first time, accurately measures - American Indian success in higher education.

At the spring 2004 meeting, the AIHEC Board of Directors passed the following resolution in support of the AIHEC-AIMS project:

“The AIHEC Board of Directors should take an active role in the development of a definition of Tribal College and University student success and should support the AIHEC-Lumina initiative. Further, each Tribal College should participate, to the maximum extent possible, in all activities associated with the initiative.”

The AIMS Key Indicator System (AKIS) was developed under the guidance of the AIMS Advisory Panel and Tribal College and University presidents and registrars. AIHEC would like to express its appreciation for the time and effort given during the development of the instruments.

<p>Navajo Technical University has roots in the "Navajo Skills Center," established in 1979, to assist a largely unemployed population to develop work skills so that they could find jobs in and around the Navajo Nation. The Navajo Skills Center successfully provided workforce education and assisted the graduates with obtaining jobs. As the Skills Center became more effective, the students began requiring more academic and advanced training and education. Thus, the Board of Directors encouraged the development of an educational vision to meet those needs, and in 1985, the Crownpoint Institute of Technology was created as the first higher education institution focused on vocational and technology degrees on the Navajo Nation. This led to the successful development of associate of applied science degrees (AAS) that expanded the school's mission. No longer did the school only provide courses of study that led to professional or vocational certification, but it also offered degree programs. In 1994, the institution became part of the land grant system of colleges and universities in the United States. Then, in 2005, with another name change, Navajo Technical College (NTC) became a fully accredited institution of higher learning with the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Schools and Colleges. In 2012, the Navajo Technical College Board directed the administration to become a university. The Navajo Nation Council was approached twice before it approved the request in July 2013; the Higher Learning Commission gave its approval in fall 2013. The Navajo Nation's first university offers nine bachelor degree programs, the only master's degree in Diné Culture, Language and Leadership anywhere in the world, 17 associate degrees and 23 certificates. The University has three locations: Crownpoint, NM (main campus), Chinle, AZ and Teec Nos Pos, AZ.</p>	
<b>Please share the top two successes of your institution for Academic Year 2017-18.</b>	
<p>Earlier in spring 2018 NTU was granted \$14.3 million towards construction for a 270 unit dormitory. We will begin construction on this upcoming spring 2019. Our campus also expanded by opening two instructional sites in Kirtland, NM and Zuni, NM. The Bond Wilson Technical Center in Kirtland, NM was a collaboration with Central Consolidated School District to offer specific college courses for high school and college students in that area. This partnership included businesses and organizations in the Four Corners region (Arizona, Utah, Colorado and New Mexico.) Zuni Pueblo Community and Navajo Technical University also collaborated and agreed to open an instructional site in Zuni, NM. Students will begin registering in the spring 2019 semester. Our campus in Chinle, Arizona also celebrated their ground breaking event for a new campus.</p>

<p>As with many higher education institutions across the nation, we are struggling with student enrollment. During the AY 1718, our institution decreased again from the previous year. Another significant challenge our institution faces is filling various vacant positions, including our Nursing instructors and Nursing Director.</p>
